

2018 Manitoba Winter Games Power by Manitoba Hydro

Technical Package

Sport: ARCHERY

Age and Equipment Categories

Athlete Age Classes

- Cadet Male
- Cadet Female
 - Athletes may be up to age 16 as of January 01 2018
 - Athletes younger than Cadet Class will compete as the Cadet Class

Athlete's Equipment Divisions

Athletes will compete in either:

- Recurve Division
- or
- Compound Division

Eligibility

Athletes who are resident members of their respective region are eligible to compete except that the following athletes are not eligible to compete:

1. The athlete is a member of a National Team prior to January 1, 2018
2. As per the 2017/2018 ABAM Provincial Target Team Program Document, any athlete that has attained Provincial Target Team Elite Squad Criteria prior to July 16, 2017.

Team Composition

Each regional team may consist of:

Athletes

- 8 archers – 2 per age class, gender and equipment division
 - 2 Cadet Men Recurve
 - 2 Cadet Women Recurve
 - 2 Cadet Men Compound
 - 2 Cadet women Compound

Coach and Manager

- 1 coach
- 1 team manager

Athlete Selection Process and Timelines

Regional Team members will be selected based on their ranking at respective regional trials.

Trials and initial team selection must be completed at least one month prior to the Manitoba Winter Games.

Coach and Manager Selection Process and Timeline

Coaches and Managers will be selected as determined by the Regional Sport Organization.

One of Coach or Manager must be male and the other female.

Coach/manager must be 18 years of age and over as of January 1st, 2018.

It is encouraged that all coaches are NCCP Instructor of Intermediate Archers trained or certified.

Competitive Format

The competitions will be Indoor Target Rounds as described in Archery Canada rules section 4.5.2.1 and 4.5.2.4.

There will be separate competitions for:

- males and females and mixed team (1 male & 1 female)
and
- Compound and Recurve Divisions

Target Events

Events will include:

1. Individual 18m Round (4.5.2.1) for ranking
followed by
2. Individual Elimination match play
followed by
3. Individual medals matches
also
4. Mixed Teams Eliminations and Finals match play

Individual Elimination match play

Event Formats

Ranking Rounds

The Ranking Rounds will be the Indoor Target 18 m Round (WA 4.5.2.1) which consists of 20 ends of three arrows (total 60 arrows) shot on a 40cm World Archery target face.

- 40cm full target face and 40 cm triple face may be used for Regional Trials;
- The use of 40cm single and or vertical triple faces during the Manitoba Games events will be at the discretion of the Technical Delegate.

Ties in ranking are decided by the greater of 10s and then greater number of 9s. *There are no shoot-offs for critical ties since all archers will enter the elimination match play events.*

Individual Elimination Matches

Elimination matches will be shot consistent with the Indoor Match Round (WA 4.5.2.4) consist of:

- for Recurve Division matches (WA 4.5.2.4.1) - best of 5 sets of three arrows (maximum 15 arrows) with sets scoring. Target faces will be recurve 40cm vertical triple face or 40 cm full face at the discretion of the Technical Delegate.
- for Compound Division matches (WA 4.5.2.4.2) - 5 ends or three arrows (15 arrows) with cumulative scoring. Target faces will be compound 40cm vertical triple faces.

All ends are shot simultaneously.

Ties in cumulative score for Compound or sets points for Recurve are critical ties broken by single arrow shoot-offs.

Team Elimination match play

Mixed Team Elimination Matches

Mixed Team matches are the same as for Elimination matches except:

- teams consist of 2 archers, one female and one male, shooting two arrows each;
- for Recurve Division matches - best of 4 sets of four arrows (2 each archer) (maximum 16 arrows) with sets scoring,

and

- For Compound Division matches - 4 ends or four arrows (2 each archer) (16 arrows) with cumulative scoring.

Equipment

Archers' Equipment shall be consistent with World Archery rules for the:

- Recurve Division (WA 11.1) and
- Compound Division (WA 11.2.)

Uniforms

Regional Team uniforms shall be worn by all team members during official practice, competitions and awards presentation, and as otherwise directed by the respective Regional Team managers.

Dress regulations consistent with World Archery and Archer Canada rules Chapter 20 will apply to all participants, including coaches, assistants and support staff for the competing regions. Clothing that is offensive, poor in taste, or is disrespectful to the PSMG and affiliates is not allowed.

The Director of Shooting will make any decisions pertaining to the dress code and will be enforced by the Judges and Team Officials.

OFFICIALS

Officials shall be appointed by the PSO.

Judges

Judges for regional events shall be at least certified Local Judge.

Judges for the Provincial Games Finals shall be at least certified Provincial Judge.

Directors of Shooting

Directors of Shooting for Regional trials may be one of the officiating judges.

Director(s) of shooting for Provincial Games Finals will be appointed by the PSO and shall be at least certified Local Judge.

Technical Delegate(s)

A Technical Delegate will be appointed by the PSO to act as Technical Delegate for the Provincial Games Finals, undertaking the respective duties (WA 3.5.4.1 & AC 3.5.4.1) and with authority to make decisions on the technical aspects of the tournaments as needed.

Regional Technical Delegates may be appointed to assist the Regional Organizing Committee. In most cases this may also be the Chairman of the Judge Commission for the Regional Trials. In any event, the Games Final Technical Delegate may be consulted as needed.

REGIONAL POINT SCORING

Sport points will be awarded as follows:

1st place Target – 8 points	5th place Target – 4 points
2nd place Target – 7 points	6th place Target – 3 points
3rd place Target – 6 points	7th place Target – 2 points
4th place Target – 5 points	8th place Target – 1 point
1 st place Mixed Team – 8 points	3 rd place Mixed Team – 4 points
2 nd place Mixed Team – 6 points	4 th place Mixed Team – 2 points

Regional points will be determined by adding the total cumulative sport points and ranking the total.
